#### **5. CITIZENS REPORT**

This email was sent in for Mayor & Council, from Natasha Dyer.

I would like to ask a question tonight at the council meeting. Last month I asked about what had become of the discussion to create quiet zones with the trains that run through downtown Austell at all hours of the day and night. Unfortunately, the mayor didn't answer the question, didn't share any timeline, what timing is being investigated. He just kind of mentioned that business also wants a quiet zone but would not allude to the timing of the quiet zone. Quiet zones are a pretty common thing, and so they have a pretty well-defined way to go about setting them up. The City may need to help pitch in costs for upgrading railroad crossings to meet design requirements, but there're federal pools of money that can also be tapped for doing so. Again, I would like to know what has become of the discussion to create quiet zones with the trains that run through downtown Austell at all hours of the day and night...especially when we are sleeping. Thank you. Mayor Clemons thanked her for providing the information about quiet zones. He stated that he has met with the Federal Railroad Association & went to all the crossings needed in this study. Mayor Clemons stated that Ms. Dyer needs to contact Darrell Weaver, Community Affairs Director, for more background information & where we are at in the process.

The email was sent in for Mayor & Council from Ann Turner.

For what was the spraying being done on the grass behind the old playground? If it was for weeds, they are not nearly the problem the many fire ant hills at the junction of the sidewalk and the grass in front of the retaining wall are. And those are growing larger by the day. Are there plans to eliminate those potential dangers? (I use 20 Mule Team Borax on the ones here in our yard. Nontoxic to anything but those pesky ants.) Are there any plans to eliminate any of the poison ivy runners that are proliferating along the new trail? Or the ones that are on the creek-side of the walkway? Yes, they are constant problems, but careful removal (I use long handled pliers) and insertion into black garbage bags seems to kill them. Burning is not the solution, nor is grinding and making the stems part of landfills or compost. And poisons just further exaggerate the declining pollinator problems. (The same way liquid poisons do for lawn weeds.) I will be so, so, so glad when I can ask these questions when we can all see each other. Mayor Clemons directed the question to the Community Affairs Director, Darrell Weaver. Mr. Weaver stated he spoke with our Parks Manager, Zach Evans, and this is a work in progress, and will all be taken care of as they go along.

These increases will primarily be funded by additional franchise fees and property tax revenue. It is the recommendation to conduct the public hearing for the 1<sup>st</sup> reading of the 2021-22 Preliminary Fiscal Year Budget and answer any questions.
